<p>The comprehensive exam, given during the summer between the first and second years, measures student learning of key concepts and skills in the first year core courses. The comp exam is composed of two comprehensive essay questions; each question includes content from each of the core courses in an integrated planning scenario. The object of the exam is to identify areas in which individual students require further instruction. The exam is not designed to fail students or prevent students from continuing in the program</p> <p>Pass rates are calculated at four stages:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Initial exam submission: the percent who pass the exam as submitted • Oral follow-up: the percent who pass following the oral follow-up, a 5-30 minute meeting with faculty in which students respond to correct or elaborate on content in the first written submission.
